Membership Update



A Role for Everyone

At our recent Club Assembly, I shared how we are approaching Membership Growth and Development through four main roles.

And we talked about how each member can contribute to each of these roles. Our focus over the next weeks will be the first role: to generate prospects.

What can each member do?

Each of us can create a personalized prospect list. Think about your family, friends, and acquaintances. As we interact with those we frequently see, we may not have thought of them in terms of – he/she would be a great Rotarian! When that thought crosses our minds, it's time to share our Rotary stories! And it's time to invite them.

What is the Membership Team doing?

The Membership Team is creating a prospect list by looking at Rotarians who have left D7750 clubs. Here are specifics so far.

- ▶ Step 1: Develop full list of those in D7750 who have recently left
 - Completed: Obtained list of all who left D7750 clubs in most recent years
 - In progress: Reviewing the list to eliminate names of those we should not contact (deceased, not in good standing, etc.)
- ▶ Step 2: Develop a protocol with narrative for contact that includes asking the respective AG, Past President, and President of clubs to review names (District leadership is aware and supportive of plans)
 - In progress: The protocol has been developed. Narrative for the communications to club leaders and former club members has been developed. A Beta test has been launched with initiating contact. Replies/results will be used to modify protocol and narrative. D7750 leadership is being updated on progress.

We look forward to welcoming your invitees to our weekly meetings in the coming weeks!


Acts of Love
