

Plus, we will look like the cohesive, fun club that we are!

- Use the “Rename” feature of Zoom to show your name, where you live along with your current/past occupation. You can even list your current or past office in Rotary. Does this sound like too much? Probably not for a newcomer because they'll have time to look around the screen throughout the meeting.
- Select a unique background that speaks to some aspect of who you are.
- Send a short note of “Welcome” in the chat box.
- Mention guests by name during Happy Bucks.
- Log in early and join in the conversation when you'll have the time to share a personal welcome.
- If you know the guest, send a special email after the meeting to express how happy the club is that they logged in for our meeting.
- For returning guests, make a note to say welcome back!



Food of the Future

What is breadfruit? How about amaranth? Are they better than corn and rice? In a recent article on rotary.org, Amy Hoak explores scientific research on breadfruit, its ability to withstand drought, and how it can produce enough to feed the world in the future.

In the quest for food sources that can withstand a rapidly changing climate, there's one conspicuously curious crop: the breadfruit, a spiky green orb native to the Malay Archipelago that's surprisingly versatile and packed with nutrition.

The starchy fruit, long a staple in the tropics, is attracting new interest globally as farmers and scientists search for crops that are hardier while still nutrient dense. The need is critical. Nearly half of the world's food calories come from just three crops: rice, wheat, and corn. - Through club funds and a matching grant, we will expand Acts of Green in 2024 to include activities with the Anderson Career & Technology Center, Wren High School, and McCormick Elementary School. THANKS to the Mark Makuliski Donor Advised Fund for approving our matching grant to expand this year! And THANKS to our club and District 7750 for making it possible.
 - Anderson Career & Technology Center—Culinary Garden Enhancement
 - Their culinary students will enhance a campus culinary garden to include herbs and vegetables which will then be used to create delicious meals in their classes.
 - McCormick Elementary School—Garden Pond Installation & Corner Garden Upgrade
 - They will be installing a pre-formed pond in their corner garden, completing a corner garden for students and staff to enjoy.
 - Wren High School—Pollinator Paradise Project
 - They are planning a multi-phase approach in soil prep, then planting seeds, and then planting plants.


