

## One Year Ago...



Our club's continued commitment to environmental projects and an investment in communities is commendable. A year ago, as a part of our Acts of Green remote service project, we invested in 3 school-based garden projects. Thanks to donations from our club, an individual member, District 7750, and the Mark Makulinski Donor Advised Fund, we supported projects at McCormick Elementary School (above), Wren High School (upper right), and the Anderson District 1 & 2 Career & Technology Center (right). These gardens are ongoing through student and staff participation. Thank you for this, and for our legacy of protecting the environment and giving back!

Our club's District 7750 Grant Project is ongoing and we're back in the McCormick Schools! Sensory and Pollinator Gardens are underway at the middle and elementary schools. Funds are providing additional resources to science teachers to enhance their lessons about pollinators, the ecosystem, habitats, and the environment. We also gifted butterfly pavilions and larva so that the students could observe the lifecycle of pollinators and release them into their gardens. This is a fantastic project and another example of our #ActsofGreen. Thank you to Julia and Millie for taking on the lion's share of this project!



District 7750 applied for a Rotary Zone 33/34 Disaster Relief Grant to support food banks that suffered hardships because of Hurricane Helene. Many clubs will be engaged to serve several food banks in our district. Clubs are also asked hold a food drive to supplement the project.

Our club is partnering with the Batesburg-Leesville club to support Christ Central Ministries-Saluda Food Bank. We are now collecting food and funds that will all be delivered on the morning of 4/24.

### Needed Items for the Food Drive

- Canned meats (i.e., Vienna Sausage/Spam)
- Hot Dogs
- 1 lb rolls of ground beef or sausage
- Dried Beans (1 or 2 lb bags)
- Rice (1 or 2 lb bags)
- Peanut Butter
- Jelly/Jam/Preserves (plastic containers)
- Canned pasta dishes (Ravioli, Spaghetti O's)
- Canned tamales
- Applesauce jars (plastic) and cups
- Fruit cups
- Peanut butter or cheese crackers
- Saltine or Ritz crackers
- Pop Tarts
- Granola Bars


