two acts of individual service in the name of Rotary during the year. Record your individual service on our <u>Google Form</u>. You can share a picture there as well. Thank you all!









Adding Corporate Membership to our Club

With our December e-vote, our bylaws will be amended to add a corporate membership type. With 16 votes to accept the addition, we will follow Model A in the RI information on this subject. Model A is based on:

- A company pays or subsidizes the dues for a primary member. Dues are not charged for alternate members.
 This type can add up to 1 primary and 2 alternate members per company.
- Only the primary member is charged RI or other dues.
 The primary person is the one reported as the active member on our roster in DACdb. Alternates aren't charged RI or other dues and are not listed in DACdb.
- The primary member will proceed through the club's prospective member process as normal.
- If an alternate wants to become a full active member, they would also proceed through the process as any member would be.

We will present information on this at our January Fellowship meeting, including ideas for recruiting and making our club even more inclusive. Thank You!
