UKRANIAN AMBULANCE REQUEST

We have a unique opportunity to do some incredible good in the world.

Our District Governor, Bob Gross, learned last week about a very small Rotary club in New Jersey that has delivered three ambulances to Ukraine where they are saving lives on the front lines of war. The originator of the project is speaking at our District Conference later this month. He met a Ukrainian doctor at the International Conference in June and asked the doctor what they needed. When he said that Ukraine needed ambulances, the project began.

The Medford (NJ) Sunrise Rotary Club found well-used ambulances in Germany. Rotarians from Obernburg, Germany mechanically checked out the vehicles, provided medical and firefighting supplies to help fill each ambulance, and took the New Jersey drivers from Frankfurt to the dealership many miles away. They were *perfect* partners in service! The New Jersey Rotarians drove the ambulances across Germany and Poland to the Ukraine border.

Rotary clubs in Lviv, Ukraine then got involved. These were the local Rotary heroes. They advised what medical supplies were most-urgently needed and looked all over the country to determine where each ambulance was needed the most. The Ukraine Rotarians delivered the ambulances directly to the front-line cities where they were immediately put to use saving lives.

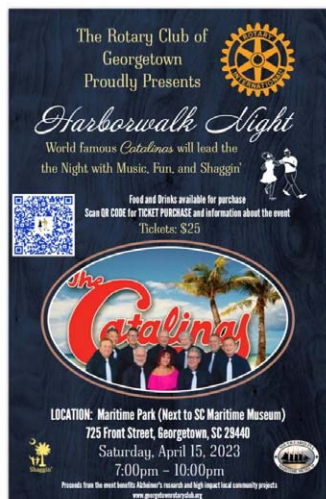
Only Rotary could take a chance meeting between two Rotarians and turn it into an international project across three countries that is saving lives every day!

Our District 7770 is going to do the same thing, utilizing the Medford Sunrise Club and its 501(c)(3) Foundation and its ambulance coordinator. We plan to raise at least \$10,000 and that will be matched by the generous contribution from a Rotarian. This will give us the funds to purchase the ambulance. We plan to partner with District 7670 in western North Carolina, who will also raise money that will fund supplies and incidentals necessary for the ambulance. Then DG Bob and a western North Carolina contact will join the New Jersey Rotarian and fly (at their own expense) to Germany to pick up the ambulance. They will then drive it across Germany and Poland and will deliver it to Ukraine Rotarians at the border.

DG Bob is asking Rotarians in our district for 100 checks for \$100 each (or more) made out to the Medford Sunrise Rotary Foundation, which is a 501(c)(3) organization.

Speaker of the Week - Bradley Adams, Football Coach and AD for Georgetown High School



Bradley Adams is beginning his 14th year as a head coach. He has been coaching for 19 years. He has held the positions of assistant coach, assistant head coach, offensive coordinator, strength and conditioning coach, special teams' coordinator, and coached several positions on the defensive side of the ball at the high school and the college level. During his 5 seasons at Woodruff High School as the head football coach, his overall coaching record was 34 wins and 23 losses. While at Woodruff each of his teams

qualified for the playoffs all five seasons and made two 3rd round appearances in the playoffs.

During his six years at Georgetown High School, he was the head coach and Athletic Director. He was the winningest coach in school history. His overall record was 40 wins and 27 losses. He was the only head coach to go consecutive seasons without a losing season. He coached numerous players that were chosen for the North/South game and many who went on to play football at the collegiate level. He was the head coach at Union County High School for two years prior to being at Woodruff.

He graduated from Loris High School and went on to graduate from Newberry College, where he was a member of the football team, with a Bachelor of Arts in History with a minor in Physical Education. While at Newberry College, he coached running backs and recruited the Pee Dee area of South Carolina. He has his Masters in Secondary Education from Grand Canyon University and his Ed. S in Educational Leadership-Principalship from Arkansas State University.

Bradley is married to Jennifer, who has two daughters, Gracie and Sunni. Bradley and Jennifer live with their three dogs, Biggie, Peaches, and Sally.
