- *In 1981*, the Hilton Head Island Rotary Club sponsored our first Interact Club at Sea Pines Academy. Hilton Head High School Interact was founded in 1982 and the May River Academy was founded in 1985. All three clubs were actively operating programs for youth, world hunger, and helping our volunteer efforts at The Heritage Golf tournament.
- In 1919, Rotary held its first International Assembly in Chicago, an annual training event for incoming leaders. The practice would continue yearly, building connections between incoming leaders worldwide.

Team 6 - carrying and stacking bags: high physical activity: 10 Rotarians






