

Did You Know?

- *In 1998*, the Hilton Head Island Rotary Clubhosted a Valentine's fashion show luncheon headed by Rotarians Florence Albaugh and Beja Strum. The well-attended luncheon raised nearly \$14,000 for local and District 7770 Alzheimers' research projects.
- In 1921, Rotarians met in Edinburgh, Scotland, for the first convention held outside the United States. Rotarians add the advancement of peace and international goodwill to the Rotary International constitution. Prioritizing peace became part of the Object of Rotary when the Object was adopted in the 1922 Convention in Los Angeles, California. Rotarians parade through the streets of Edinburgh, Scotland, during the 1921 convention.

READ INDEED Program

The Rotary Club of Hilton Head Island selected the United Way of the Low Country's READ INDEED program as our project to help improve literacy in our communities. We encourage Rotarian's interested in literacy and helping elementary students to improve their reading to sign up for this program as soon as possible to begin tutoring in January 2025.

A child learns to read until the fourth grade. After that, they read to learn. With the help of volunteer tutors, United Way of the Lowcountry's Early Grade Reading Initiative works with Pre-K through third graders to help ensure children are prepared for success in school. Read Indeed! offers one-on-one, in-person tutoring at the following schools on Hilton Head Island or Bluffton:

- · Hilton Head School for Creative Arts
- Red Cedar Elementary School, Bluffton

Volunteer as little as two hours a week during the school calendar year

Trained Read Indeed! Volunteer reading tutors are matched with children in grades Pre-K through third grade who are identified by school literacy specialists as needing additional help with reading. These are the students who would otherwise fall through the cracks if they did not receive other intervention.

- Tutoring begins in October and January.
- Locations vary based on where tutors are needed,
- · Morning or early afternoon hours are offered based on the student's availability and your schedule.
- · Each school's hours of operation vary.
- Tutors receive training prior to and during the tutoring program. A background check is mandatory.

Your time and commitment will make a lifetime of difference to a child.


