Our virtual Double Good fundraiser will be held Thursday, Sept 11 through Monday, Sept 15 (Begins at 1:30 pm Thursday and ends at 1:30 pm on Monday.)

This project is 100% contactless, meaning we don't have to touch a bag of popcorn....the product ships directly to each buyer, and we get 50% of the profit, which will help fund our Rotary Youth Exchange Program. This year we are hosting one inbound student, Amelia from Taiwan and one outbound student, Asher who is going to Spain.

We'll each create a "Pop-Up" store and sell Double Good popcorn. Prices for signature bags (5 cups each) start at \$11. The popcorn is ultra-premium, delicious and award-winning.


New Member Inducted - Meet Cynthia Villar

- Rotary National Golf Invitation (RNGI): January 29 30, 2026. We want to encourage each club to consider putting together a golf foursome for the tournament to be held at Sea Trail Plantation & Golf Resort in Sunset Beach, NC

(just across the SC border). There will be a welcoming reception on Thursday night, 1/29 and breakfast, a late shotgun start and BBQ lunch the next day, 1/30. Foursomes will be \$150 per person (\$600 per foursome), and sponsorships opportunities range from \$150 for hole sign sponsors all the way to \$5,000 for title sponsor. This will be a fun time for all, and proceeds go to Polio Plus and CART, with each club being credited for Polio and CART contributions for their respective participation.
