

FINLAND Facts

Kauhajoki Rotary Club - Kauhajoki - Finland (Finland) -Europe

Kauhajoki (map) is a small town (12,500 inhabitants) in Western Finland, Northern Europe.

Kauhajoki Rotary Club (RotaryKauhajoki.net) has implemented youth exchange activities throughout its 70-year history.

Now in the Rotary year 2024-25 we are sending two young people on an annual exchange, one of them going to the USA and the other to Canada. In addition, our club is leaving one student for a camp exchange to the Canary Islands (Spain) and one student for a summer exchange in Germany. In addition, we receive one exchange student from Mexico and one from Canada.

Kauhajoki Rotary Club meets every Thursday evening. Our club has 34 members (32 men and 2 women), in addition to which our club has five (5) honorary members.

Nature: Kauhajoki.net → All children and young people are close to our club's heart and we also implement RotaKids activities, for example support for special children, support for children of Ukrainian war refugees and also the annual Polio collection.

We also organize, for example, the annual Rotary Olympics together with other clubs in the vicinity. In addition, we have organized a gala for charity every year on Finland's Independence Day and Valentine's Day.

The upcoming Rotary year 2024-25 will be our club's 70th year of operation and we will organize a great concert and party for charity.

We do our best that the exchange students who come to Finland and our club enjoy their great year here with us.

We wish you a very fulfilling and wonderful Rotary year 2024-25.
