Last Week's Program:

Kevin Sullivan introduced us to Nicole Milo who shared with us the compelling story of her <u>profoundly</u> autistic son, Caleb and her efforts to seek appropriate care for him. Further, her experiences in advocating for her son lead her to become an expert on the subject. She was appointed to the CT state task force charged with researching the needs of this population. That research lead directly to the passage in 2021 of HB5001, which is considered the most comprehensive law which established new mandates supporting individuals and their families who experience these types of disabilities.

As Caleb grew older, he faced his next challenge ... "aging out" of a system designed to support children with profound autism. Nicole shared with us the fact that at age 22, all of the hard-won benefits her advocacy and the changed law provided will be no longer available. For these young adults, the discontinuation of essentially all their support: residential intensive support programs, special schooling, funding for care-givers... means that these kids face the potential for regression. If their support can't be continued and they regress, and their behaviors become unmanageable, one of the potential outcomes is institutionalization or other such circumstances that no parent would wish for their child.

Consequently Nicole and other like minded individuals and parents have founded the House of Hope. The House of Hope is a local non-profit charity. Their mission is to serve the complex needs of individuals and their families, with profound autism, development and/or intellectual disabilities through Advocacy, Research, Spiritual Faith Supports, Parent/Family Supports, Residential and Vocational Planning.

House of Hope, Inc will provide a wrap around model through evidence-based therapies and programming across all settings and environments to help enable individuals and their families to have access to a continuum of care in order to gain more freedom to grow and achieve the best quality of life possible.

We thank Nicole for her time with us. It was a profound and very touching presentation. There wasn't a Rotarian there on Tuesday that wasn't affected and moved. Her PowerPoint is attached.


