Memorial Day:

"Four score and seven years ago our fathers brought forth on this continent, a new nation, conceived in Liberty, and dedicated to the proposition that all men are created equal.

Now we are engaged in a great civil war, testing whether that nation, or any nation so conceived and so dedicated, can long endure. We are met on a great battle-field of that war. We have come to dedicate a portion of that field, as a final resting place for those who here gave their lives that that nation might live. It is altogether fitting and proper that we should do this.

But, in a larger sense, we can not dedicate—we can not consecrate—we can not hallow—this ground. The brave men, living and dead, who struggled here, have consecrated it, far above our poor power to add or detract. The world will little note, nor long remember what we say here, but it can never forget what they did here. It is for us the living, rather, to be dedicated here to the unfinished work which they who fought here have thus far so nobly advanced. It is rather for us to be here dedicated to the great task remaining before us—that from these honored dead we take increased devotion to that cause for which they gave the last full measure of devotion—that we here highly resolve that these dead shall not have died in vain—that this nation, under God, shall have a new birth of freedom—and that government of the people, by the people, for the people, shall not perish from the earth."

Remembering those dedicated volunteers from Winchester who in 1861 knew sedition, treachery, and inhumanity when they saw it, and joined the fight against it. They died far from home and their bodies were never returned for burial. They considered themselves participating in a conflict which they appropriately termed a "War of the Rebellion."

Last Week's Program:

Last week Maria Coutant-Skinner introduced us to Kathy Ohm, executive director of the YMCA's Youth Service Bureaus.

She began her talk by explaining in general terms that the mission of the Youth Service Bureaus was to "help youth and families find happiness." She then detailed thereafter several of the programs that are offered.

She described Camp Rising Star and explained some of the lessons that they hope to be able to teach the campers. She noted that through the use of a token economy which rewards good behavior, the kids can be granted the ability to go on field trips to fun places such as the Connecticut Science Center, Mystic Seaport, the Beardsley Zoo... And others. She outlined the "Leaders in Training program" which is an option for older teenagers who have aged out of camp which provides those kids an opportunity for further growth and responsibility and the opportunity to assume positions of leadership amongst their

peers. She explained that (among others) there are programs on literacy and etiquette in addition to the all the fun!

Kathy also explained the area Juvenile Review Boards. Kids who get themselves into trouble with the law, depending on the severity of the offense, have an option of going before these boards which are comprised of a probation officer, a police officer, school representatives, the student, the parents and a representative from the Youth Service Bureau. These are diversionary programs represent an alternative to traditional punishment.

She discussed the Torrington Teen Center and the Community Foundation of Northwest Connecticut's Women and Girls Fund and how that fund in particular helps women to achieve their potential through the funding of internships, helping women for whom English is a second language and in general exposes women and girls to the fact that there's many different local options available to them in terms of their futures and potential careers.

It was a good talk and we were glad for the explanation as to both bureaus. Kathy is a very highly motivated individual who is clearly dedicated to the task and the YMCA is lucky to have her. Thanks to Greg Brisco for having facilitated her talk and Maria Coutant-Skinner for having introduced her.
