



In addition, she described some differences between dementia and Atheimeräe^{™s}. Dementia is the umbrela term for a collection of symptoms with cognitive decline. Atheimeräe^{™s} is the most frequent, but not the only, cause of dementia. She provided information about several risk factors and also noted that 73% of the caregivers are women. The cost of Atheimeräe^{™s} is over \$300 billion annually, and projected to rise considerably.
