Thank You Ivonne.

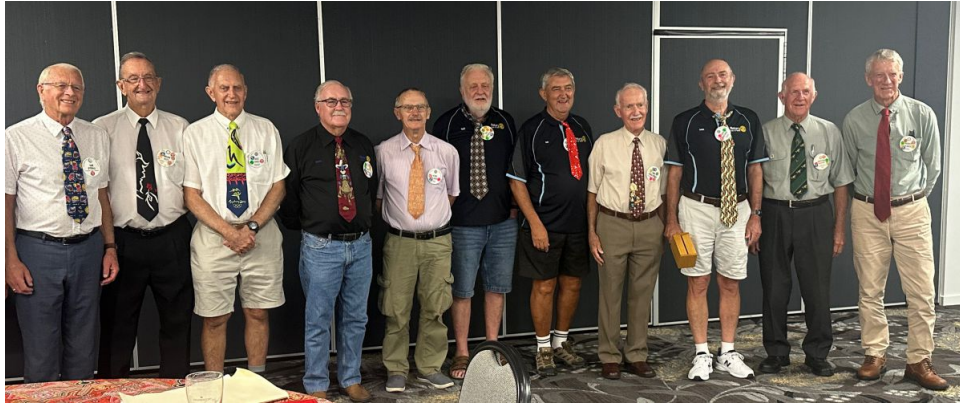


Herb Beer: Memorable Tie Evening

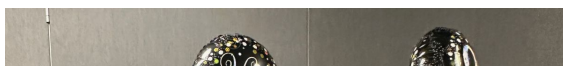
Brian Holes 90th Birthday Celebration

International Service Project in the Philippines - part 1 completed

Dear Fellow Club Members in Taree,

I am pleased to report that our club-supported International project in the Philippines in cooperation with Medical Mission of Mercy USA (MMOM) and the local Rotary Club of General Santos City had been in motion during the week of Feb 5-9th 2024 and part 1 is now completed!

Volunteers myself, GP-Obstetrician Dr Grace Maano and Registered Midwife Jane Wright provided Women's Health Service:

1. 102 free pap smear in 3 days
- 2 Training on Obsteric Emergencies (TOEs) for 20 midwives from 9 different low risk birthing facilities

These services are part of the bigger Medical/Dental/Optometry/Major/Minor Surgical servuces provided by MMOMUSA - a total of 95 volunteer delegates, Feb 5-9, 2024 at Royeca Hospital and satellite mission venues with (preliminary) total of 2,559 lives served:

Major Surgery - 73
Minor Surgery - 115
Dental - 491
Optometry - 868
Adult medical consultation - 560
Pediatric medical consultation - 403
Women's Health - 122

The Australian volunteer team will now have a bit of R&R this weekend, but watch this space as we go onto the next adventure/mission next week.... at Lucena City, Quezon Province Philippines!

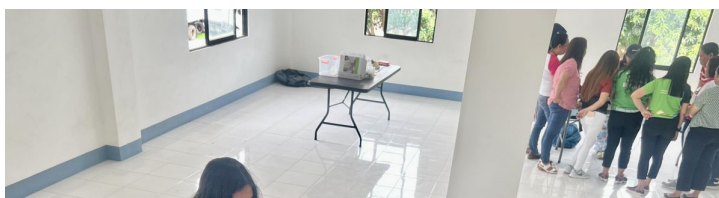
The local Women's health team led by the Family Planning coordinator Mrs Merchel gabonado (3rd from right) receiving donated plastic speculums (for pap smear), suturing equipment and IUD insertion instruments from Australia.



Pap smear services for free was well appreciated by women who were able to avail of them, saving \$44aud (usual cost of pap smear in the Philippines).



20 midwives from 9 local birthing facilities were able to participate in a 10-day training workshop on Obstetric emergencies





TOEs - Training in Obstetric Emergencies covered life saving strategies to address: severe bleeding during delivery, shoulder dystocia when baby's shoulder is stuck at birth, imminent vaginal breech delivery (bum is presenting instead of baby's head) and newborn resuscitation. They all went home feeling confident to tackle the challenges of delivering women outside of the local maternity hospital (lying in clinic).

Thank you to our club for a donation of \$300 towards this project, rest of funds/support coming from personal donations and support from the local Rotary club of General Santos City Philippines.

Presidents Report Week 31

We have been frightfully busy over the last 2 weeks.

Our Australia Day Golf Day went ahead as planned albeit in a single morning tee off due to the extreme hot weather.

1. The player numbers are well down on last year;
2. The amount received so far is about \$7,700.00 with more payments expected. It is anticipated that we will have about \$9,000.00 to distribute, but at this stage we have earmarked \$2,500.00 for each recipient - Westpac Rescue Helicopter; Australian Childrens Music Foundation; and TareeEisteddfod Smile Program;
3. Thank you letters are available to give to all sponsors; and
4. Overall , a very happy day and played in good spirits despite the extreme heat wave.

Australia Day on the Riverstage

1. Our members helped erect the gazebos in the morning after the golfers had commenced play;
2. Bruce Moy and Anna Hutchinson were the MC's on the day, and we thank them sincerely for a job well done;
3. The award ceremony had worthy recipients;
4. Susie Ploder ran the face painting stall for the children's activities;
5. International dancers from India, Papua and New Guinea, and the Philippines entailed the crowd in the afternoon.
6. Rhonda collapsed from heat exhaustion and had to be treated at the hospital;
7. The sound system during the ceremony was not very loud;
8. Good entertainment for the night session;
9. Crowd numbers were well down due to the heat;
10. No funding for fireworks;
11. Allen Tickle was the only Midcoast councillor to be present on the day; and
12. Tanya Thompson MP was a welcome guest.

Dr Grace called from the Philippines.

1. A Program of Scale for the Congo is planned for later this year along with Lucy Hopgood-Brown;
2. Consider a district grant for Early Connections playground equipment;
3. Womens Health Week to be conducted in September;
4. A fundraising fashion parade to be held when a suitable date can be found;
5. Tanja from Little Blue Shed will be our guest speaker in March;
6. The Rotary Club of Okayama Chuo is to visit in June. We need to get fund-raising and plan for their visit;
7. Tomomi will visit in March
8. Brennan and Dr Grace will visit Okayama Chuo club in March. The members are planning to extend every hospitality to them and show them the city.

David Denning - Service Projects

1. A new project has been accepted for the upgrade of Peters Wharf;
2. A grant to be obtained from NSW Fisheries;
3. In conjunction with Friends of Browns Creek;
4. David to supervise;
5. Design and drawings available soon;
6. Cundletown Park council do not want us to erect any infrastructure, if so we would have to maintain it for 10 years. This is not feasible.
7. Rotary Park maintenance to be undertaken in April/May
8. David has been nominated for Chair of RAWCS Eastern Division subject to the District Governors acceptance.
9. Suggested that our guest speaker proceeds be split between RAWCS (includes Rotarians Against Malaria) and End Polio and this was accepted.
10. Bicentennial Gardens, 3 picnic shelters erected, 2 gas BBQs to be installed, front garden to be replanted, the boat-shaped gardens to be redone,
11. A cantilever deck to be constructed, and QR codes to be erected.
12. Ask council to consider installing solar lights between Sailoâ€™s and the park entrance.

Susie Ploder - Membership

1. Outlined the current state of our membership.
2. Several prospective members are being considered. More on this later.
3. Membership in general was discussed. We seem to be doing more work for Not-For-Profits than fundraising for our club. Each project should be considered carefully.

Other

1. Invitations have been sent to Okayama Chuo for their upcoming visit
2. Invitation to Tomomi inviting her to visit on a short student exchange
3. Letters of introduction have been provided to Brennan and Dr Grace for their upcoming visit to Okayama.
4. Book shed assistance has commenced. 2 helpers are required each Tuesday from 12:30 to 2:30 for book unpacking and sorting and 4 people each market day, say in 2 shifts. Roster to be circulated to all members.
5. A vocational visit to Westpac Rescue Service should be considered for our future vocational visits.
