This was a very eye-opening view of AI and the impact that it will have on lives in the future.







Presidents Report Week 5 2024 - 25

This week we enjoyed our very own Prof Frances Rosamond FRSN giving us an update on World Mathematics after recently attending the 15th International Congress on Mathematics Education. She gave two workshops at the Congress about the mathematical foundations of computing.

The 15th International Congress on Mathematics Education (ICME-15) will be held 7-14 July 2024 at International Convention Centre in Sydney, Australia.

15th International Congress on Mathematics Education (ICME)

The International Congress on Mathematical Education (ICME) is the largest international conference on mathematics education in the world. This quadrennial event is organised under the auspices of the International Commission on Mathematical Instruction (ICMI) and explores current global trends in mathematics education research and mathematics teaching practices at all levels.

The 15th ICME took place 7-14 July 2024 at the International Convention Centre in Sydney, Australia, showcasing established and emerging thought leaders from around the world. It was hosted by ICMI and UNSW. Over 2500 attended from 97 countries.

The International Commission on Mathematical Instruction was founded in 1908 to foster the improvement of mathematics teaching and learning worldwide. It does so by organizing ICME as well as helping support thematic and regional affiliate organizations, including the Mathematics Education Research Group of Australasia (MERGA). There are 87 member countries of ICMI. It is a commission of the International Mathematics Union.

In addition to MERGA, the national mathematics organizations in Australia, many with special interest groups and affiliate organizations, include the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Mathematics Alliance (ATSIMA)

Australian Academy of Science

The Australian Association of Mathematics Teachers Inc. (AAMT)

Australian Mathematical Sciences Institute (AMSI)

Australian Mathematical Society

Australian Maths Trust (AMT)

Statistical Society of Australia

Stronger Smarter Institute (SSI)

Additionally, there are state, territory and local mathematics organisations supporting research, industry and applications, university and school teaching.

Fran highlighted some interesting facts about the current shortage of mathematics teachers. Retiring teachers and other factors make this a problem not only for Australia, but worldwide. A 2021 report on Australia's teaching workforce found that 40% of those teaching high school mathematics were not trained to teach mathematics. "The size of the problem is enormous," says Professor Tim Marchant, Director of the Australian Mathematical Sciences Institute. "Mathematics is vital to Australia's future, both for individuals and the economy."

Fran then gave us a practical demonstration where we gathered to determine an algorithm for finding the most efficient method of organising a pipeline between multiple points on a network. A sample network was drawn on the floor and we had to determine the most efficient route.

Needless to say, we were amazed at how inefficient our design was.

It looks like we have to do a lot more math thinking!

Thank you, Fran, for a very informative and fun meeting.
