



The founder and charter President of the Rotary Club of Penrith was Oscar Fletcher. He was a leader in community. For many years he operated a huge department in High Street which was later taken over by Myers. He was largely instrumental in the forming of many organisations in the town including Penrith Valley Chamber of Commerce, the first Parents & Citizens Association. He served Penrith as an Alderman on Penrith Council. He took the initiative to form the Rotary Club and guided it through its infancy.




